On Tuesday January 22nd, the boys in Room 8 enjoyed a visit by Dean Dokkie is a member of west Moberly First Nation from northern British Columbia. The community is located 1,200 km north of Vancouver in the peace river region. Dean, a native Cree and Dunneza speaker, is an elder and a community leader for many years. He gave the boys a talk on his community history, language, culture and the hunting and backwoods skills he learned in the bush growing up.

David Day Drumming. David has just finished his drumming sessions with us. This is one of the favourite co-curricular activities in which the boys engage. The combination of listening skills, keeping in rhythm, beating out a 4 part beat and overlaying it with another 2 part is a challenge- but one which many of the boys meet successfully. The combination of drums, bells and shakers makes for a very rich sound. There is also an SESE component to David's work as he teachers the boys about the origins of the various drums and bells. The boys know about an asalato and a agogo bell. He also taught them how some tribes recycle gourds to make sharers from them.
