As we approach the Christmas season, there is much to report and reflect on. Boys new to 'big school' in junior infants and other classes have settled well into routines as evidenced by how well everyone performed at the various Christmas shows and events.

Welcome back: I am delighted to welcome back Ms. Elaine Keenan who has returned to teach the boys in Room 2.

Homework meetings: These have been held for all year groups, I want to thank the teachers for organizing these meetings as well as Parents for attending.

<u>Meeting with teacher:</u> Teachers are more than willing to have a quick chat with parents- these informal meetings are best held at collection time after school.

<u>Parent-teacher meetings for junior infants and first classes:</u> These will be held on Tuesday & Thursday January 28th and 30th January. Teachers will be in contact early in the new year to make arrangements.

Language Curriculum in-service: All 4 schools on the campus held their language in-service day on November 5th. This was a very successful day for us and led to sharing of best practice by our staff on effective strategies for language teaching (Gaeilge & English). We have allotted time at each staff meeting to build on initiatives we took on that day.

Frásaí na seachtaine: Each week, class teachers teach a topical frása gaelach to the boys. Boys from classes take it in turns to read the phrase over the PA to the entire school community. This is among the initiatives we have implemented on foot of our language in-service.

<u>Christmas plays</u>: Since Hallowe'en when scripts were circulated among the teachers concerned, the teachers and boys have been using any spare moments to practise the songs for their Christmas shows. As we approached the beginning of December, the effort ratcheted up and rehearsals on stage with light and sound became the norm. The proof of the pudding really did come through in the eating as over the past week, the boys in junior infants and 1st classes have performed for us here, our neighbours in the other three Belgrove schools and on Thursday last finally for you the Parents and grandparents.

"Santa's List": This was produced by the teachers of our junior infant classes it was simply magical- seeing boys who have only been in school for about 14 weeks knowing their lines, their cues, when to speak and move and most importantly how to sing out in unison was amazing. Santa recalled all the things he needed on his list to make Christmas special- he was helped by his reindeer, and robins as well as a host of other character from the Christmas story

"Tinsel and Tea Towels": it is audition time for the Christmas play and parents receive a letter from school asking them to supply their child with a costume- in the middle of all the commotion, school life is disturbed by the visit of two inspectors Mr. Precise and Mr. Particular who ask the boys to continue on as if they were not there...... A case of art imitating life! Real-life characters

from THIS school figure prominently. Worrying for staff to see impersonations so true to life..... which brought great laughs from the parent audience!!

<u>Carol Service</u>: On Friday December 13th, our focus shifted from our school plays to the religious aspect of Christmas when our senior infant and 2nd classes held a carol service in St. Gabriel's Church. We had wonderful singing from Senior Infants and 2nd classes, readings on the nativity story by boys across a number of classes and beautiful carolling! Again, it was great for us to see so many parents and grandparents present to support the boys. Well done to all involved!

<u>Thursday & Friday 19th and 20th December</u>: We had a Christmas theme and all boys wore a Christmas jumper or a Christmas hat.

<u>Santa in Belgrove</u>: On Thursday, despite his hectic pace of life and very busy schedule, Santa visited all the classrooms with a gift for everyone. If your child was absent, the gift will be kept for him until he returns to school.
